
PETER (BOB) LUNGO (posthumously)

Bob, his wife Pat (deceased), and their three children Pete, Cindy, and Paul lived on W. 102nd St. in the Thrush neighborhood. Bob's given name is Peter, but he was known by all of his friends as 'Bob'. He was an active Teamster member and delivered Pepsi products, and later beer, to stores and taverns. In fact, he was affectionately called 'Beer Man' to those on his sales route.

Bob became very active with the various sports programs at St. Ignatius of Antioch in the 60's and 70's. He coached many of our baseball, football, track and basketball teams, leading several to league championships within the respective CYO, IFL, and IBA Programs. His teams under the banner of Niagra University were powerhouses in the intramural leagues. Many of Bob's players moved on to star in athletics at the high school level. His son Pete, called 'JR', was an excellent athlete at St. Ignatius of Antioch and later an all scholastic in football and basketball at Holy Name High School.

Bob was a caring coach who helped many of our students get into the high school of their choice. He worked with them and their families in procuring financial aid when necessary. His life seemed to revolve around not only those he coached, but all of the student athletes from our community.

When not coaching, Bob assisted the Athletic Director in administration of the sports programs, even performing referee duties and working at the admissions desk on game days. It was in the early 70's that our old basketball scoreboard broke, and Bob got the Teamsters, through Pepsi, to donate a new state of the art scoreboard and Pepsi sign to St. Ignatius. Bob was always involved with all of the sports fund raisers, procuring ads, donations, and even uniforms for the athletic programs.

After leaving St. Ignatius in the late 70's, Bob continued as coach and mentor at Sts. Phillip and James, and also at his boyhood parish St. Boniface.

Bob is a welcome addition to the 2014 Hall of Fame Class at St. Ignatius of Antioch.

RAYMOND SZCZEPANIAK (Class of 1977)


Ray played in the Vatican and Varsity (Notre Dame) leagues during his time as a student at St. Ignatius of Antioch. He went on to Holy Name High School where he played four years, teaming with Bob Lungo's son 'JR' on the Namers basketball squad.

After high school, Ray enrolled at Kent State University and, as a 'walk-on', earned an athletic scholarship there. He proved that hard work and determination is best served with the effort he put forth to earn a starting position on the KSU team. There may have been players at KSU with more raw talent than Ray, but he played all four years in his collegiate career, showing that hard work beats talent, when talent does not work hard!

Ray continued to mentor the youth as he coached for a few years at St. Ignatius in the IBA program, and won a league title with the Pirates in the Antioch League. After leaving St. Ignatius, Ray coached a while at St. Christopher in Rocky River, and now coaches in the CYO basketball league at LCA.

Ray and his wife Maggi live in Lakewood and are members of St. Christopher parish. Ray is a Sales Manager for a major medical equipment company dealing with surgeons and hospitals in the heart related equipment arena. They have three children, a daughter who is a Freshman at the University of New England playing on the volleyball team, a son who is a Freshman at St. Edward High, playing as a starter on the "Gold" basketball team, and a 3rd grader who is a student at LCA and currently plays in the IBA Antioch League.

For over 50 years, each of these individuals have given generously as a coach, youth advocate, and mentor to the youth of the Saint Ignatius community. We are thankful and proud of the milestones they have achieved in molding hundreds of children in and around the city of Cleveland while exemplifying the highest ideals of citizen involvement and preservation of community spirit.

Alan E. DeWerth



Alan DeWerth, simply known as "Big Al" to his many friends and fellow coaches, is one that the community of St. Ignatius is proud to have as a mentor to the youth he has served for so long and so well.

A lifelong resident of Cleveland who grew up on the near west side, Al, a West Tech graduate, was a gifted athlete who participated in football and track at WTH. In 1957 he married his sweetheart, Beatrice, raising three children in their home on Almira Avenue, where he still resides today.

It was the early 60's when Al began volunteering as a coach at St. Ignatius, his parish. He was involved in all of the school sports – football, track, basketball, baseball, and even volleyball as a player on the Holy Name Society men's team. When Al and Bea started their family, all of their children (Alan 'Little Al', Denise, and Kevin)

attended St. Ignatius and participated in the sports programs. As adults, Al Jr. and Denise became coaches in the sports programs, and Denise still coaches. Like her father, Big Al, Denise is a member of the St. Ignatius of Antioch Sports Hall of Fame. Al was inducted in the 1999 inaugural election.

Al continues to give back to the youth he coaches, which he has done for over 50 years at St. Ignatius of Antioch. The students in our I.B.A. basketball program are from over 30 schools throughout the city, and it is because of good people like Alan DeWerth that the program is so successful in teaching the children lifelong lessons in participation, sportsmanship, and community citizenship.

Al is retired from his career of more than 35 years at General Motors in their engineering departments in Cleveland and Detroit, MI. He and Beatrice (deceased) are proud grandparents of six boys and girls, most of which also played in the I.B.A.

Al is a gifted and amazing athlete. He still competes in softball, having earned many awards as MVP, as well as a Men's Senior Division National Championship title for Joseph Chevrolet.


We are truly blessed and grateful to have Alan DeWerth share his time and talent with the youth of the St. Ignatius of Antioch community.

Stephen E. Hanigosky

For greater than 50 years, Mr. Hanigosky has been instrumental in his guidance, leading the youth of the community in various athletic sports programs not only for the students of St. Ignatius of Antioch, but for multiple public and private schools in and around the city of Cleveland.

Steve, a lifelong Clevelander, is a parishioner at St. Ignatius of Antioch. He graduated from the parish grade school in 1963. While in high school at West Tech, he began his involvement in the school sports programs. He stepped away for a short time earning his degree in education from Kent State University. A few years after graduating from KSU, he obtained his Masters.



He began his career as a teacher in the Cleveland school system where he taught on the elementary level for over 35 years before retiring in 2012 from Marion Selzer School. He and his wife Mary raised three children in their home on Adelaide Avenue, where he and Mary still live and remain active in community and parish activities. Their children not only played in the parish sports programs, but coached after their playing days. Steve and Mary are proud grandparents to Stella, who is two years old.

Other than the few years while Steve was at KSU, he gave back to the community as a youth advocate, coaching, teaching, and mentoring the youth of the neighborhood not only at St. Ignatius of Antioch, but at the schools where he taught and most recently at Trinity High School, where he is the Freshman basketball coach.

Mr. Hanigosky is more than wins and losses, he is a dedicated and involved community leader. He has not only earned the respect of his coaching peers but more importantly of the several thousand students he has taught and coached for more than 50 years. In 2000 he was deservedly honored as an inductee to the St. Ignatius of Antioch Sports Hall of Fame.


We as a parish, community, and city are thankful and blessed to have Stephen Hanigosky as a part of our lives.
