

IN MEMORY OF
JORDAN JOHNSON

This past June 20, 2016, the I.B.A. community lost one of our bright and rising stars in Jordan Johnson, who passed away at the age of 19. Jordan had a loving and joyful attitude and would always bring a smile to your face and make you laugh. There was no such thing as boredom when Jordan was around. He was the team comedian and always the life of the party. He could connect with people of different backgrounds and ages and make everyone feel like family.

Jordan, along with his twin brother Lawrynce, started his I.B.A. career in the 3rd grade playing for the Bearcats coached by Brian Wypasek. He then went on to play with the Friars in the Vatican City League and Seton Hall in the Boys Varsity League coached by Andrew Suvak and Jeff Harris. Jordan may be the only player to reach the championship game in all 6 years he played in the I.B.A., winning three of those championship games, 1 with the Bearcats and 2 with the Friars.

Although Jordan wasn't the fastest or the most athletic or the most talented, you would never know by the confidence he played with on the court. Jordan had a very competitive nature and was a natural born leader. He never missed practice and spent a lot of his practice time working with younger teammates to help them improve. The teams he played for fed off his energy both in practice and in games. After his I.B.A. career, Jordan went on to play for our High School C.Y.O. basketball team coached by Lou Malone. It was at this time with his leadership ability and willingness to help other players that Jordan became an assistant coach to Lou on the Notre Dame Fighting Irish in the Boys Varsity League.

In addition to basketball, Jordan was also a great baseball player which was his main sport. He was one of the top pitchers in his class and a force to be reckoned with on the mound. He took that same leadership and spirit that he had in basketball to all the leagues he played in West Denison, Cleveland Baseball Federation, Cleveland RBI, Strongsville Titan, Up to Bat and Team Cleveland.

It is because of his leadership and willingness to help his teammates that we will honor him always with the "Jordan Johnson Leadership Award" to one of the High School C.Y.O. player who shows those qualities that Jordan showed throughout his athletic career. While we will always miss you, we will always smile when we think of you just as you made us smile when we would see you.

IN MEMORY OF
PHIL SWINDERMAN

Phil Swinderman passed away suddenly on July 21, 2016 at the age of 56. The I.B.A. lost a great friend, coach and mentor. Phil was very much respected by his fellow coaches, players and the parents of players that he coached. On the day of his passing many coaches commented on Facebook on how he helped them as a coach, and his willingness to give advice and help in any way he could.

Phil graduated from St. Ignatius of Antioch in 1974, where he played football, baseball and basketball. He then went on to play football at West Tech High School as a lineman where he attained West Senate and City awards. He was also an acclaimed wrestler for the West Tech Warriors.

Phil started coaching in the I.B.A. in 1991 with the Sistine Chapel Eagles in the Vatican City League, with longtime friend and Assistant Coach Bruce Bethany. Phil won 5 Championships as a coach in the Vatican City League and numerous other league titles as an assistant coach. Phil also coached in the Antioch League with the Tigers, was an assistant coach with the Holy Cross Lady Crusaders along with his daughter Melanie and coach Steve Hanigosky. He also assisted in the Boys Varsity league with Holy Cross and Dayton. Always willing to help the program, Phil took the reins for our High School Girls CYO Basketball team with Michelle Dreamer as his assistant, now the head coach of the Lady Crusaders. Phil also took on the responsibility as Head Coach of our CYO Volleyball Team for several years along with Jackie Petrus. He also played in our Men's Volleyball League for more than 20 years. When the I.B.A. decided to have commissioners for each of the leagues, Phil willingly added that responsibility to his duties as Commissioner of the Antioch League. It is because of this devotion to St. Ignatius Athletics that he was inducted into our Hall of Fame in 2005.

Phil's abilities were well appreciated and respected by his Peers. Many coaches would base their coaching and team performance for the year as to how well they played against one of Phil's teams. His teams were always hard to beat due to his coaching and solid fundamentals that he instilled in to his players. He was a player's coach, teaching his players to respect their opponents at all times and respect the game-win or lose. Phil above all made sure his kids had fun and enjoyed the game.

On a personal note, Phil was a great friend of mine, who helped me out as a coach, and my position as athletic director. Where ever we needed help in the I.B.A. or any of our sports programs Phil was there to lend a hand. While he didn't always agree with every decision I made we would talk about it and then he would say "I don't agree with the decision you made, but I understand why you made it" then we would go out for an adult cocktail and have many laughs.

It is because of his love of coaching and bringing out the best in all his players both as athletes and individuals, and as a role model and teacher to so many coaches in the I.B.A. that we remember him tonight by establishing the "Phil Swinderman Coach of the Year award" in his honor.

Coach Phil will always be remembered as a leader in the hearts and minds of those who had the pleasure of knowing him and being coached by him.

2017 ST. IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH HALL OF CLASS

A most deserving class of inductees has been elected to the St. Ignatius of Antioch/I.B.A. Hall of Fame. This year we honor four individuals, Pat Campbell, Devon Wood, Ron Bunner and Brian Kilbane, each one having contributed their time, talent and treasures in support of the St. Ignatius community and the youth it serves in a Christian environment.

Pat Campbell

Pat who attended SVDP School played basketball there and in our I.B.A. leagues in the late 80's and early 90's. His mom, Mary who passed away in 2013, always came to see her boys play and was a fixture courtside at the I.B.A. games. Pat was an outstanding talent on the court attaining MVP status and recognition in both the Vatican City and Boys Varsity Leagues while playing for St. Peter Basilica Cougars and St. John Red Storm. He also played soccer at SVDP. After grade school Pat went on to St. Edward and played on the Eagles basketball teams in the early 90's. Not a tall person Pat relied on swiftness and a deft outside shot as well as his ability at the free throw line. He continued his education at John Carrol University playing varsity ball under legendary coach Mike Moran. Tonight, Pat will be courtside as he is assistant coach for the Knights in the Antioch League Championship game.

Pat is a renowned Irish Dancer who might his wife Rebecca in Dublin Ireland and they will be celebrating their 10th anniversary in August. They shared quite a career in dance, having been lead dancers in Michael Flatley's "Lord of the Dance" shows in Las Vegas for a seven year stretch (1998-2004) after which they continued their dance career on a "World Tour" for almost two years. Today Pat and Rebecca are very much active in Irish Dance having two studios with over 150 students in the Cleveland area from childhood to adult. Many of their students are active in competition throughout Ohio and sometimes nationally.

Pat who owns McIntyre's Irish Pub in Westpark is especially busy this time of the year with Irish Dance performances and St. Patrick's Day upon us. Pat and Rebecca reside with their three children, Charlie (she is 11), Cillian (he is 8), and Ciara (she is 6), in Avon. They are parishioners at Holy Trinity and their children attend school there

Devon Wood

Devon Wood is a player's coach as he teaches the basic fundamentals to his players and their response is apparent in their actions on the court. Devon was an outstanding player during his playing days in the I.B.A. He did not attend St. Ignatius, going to Almira and then Garrett Morgan in the Cleveland school system. He was one of our many non-St. Ignatius students who played in our leagues. In the I.B.A. Devon played for the St. Mary Wildcats in the Vatican City League where he attained All-Star status twice and was on the All-League team as a 5th grader. He then was drafted by Fordham in the Boys Varsity League where again he earned All-Star and All-league status on those Ram squads. His Fordham team played in the championship game in his final season as an I.B.A. player.

Devon went on to John Marshall High School Where he played Varsity ball in the tough Senate League. As a senior his Lawyer team had a good season winning the State Sectional Title in 2000. Devon also played one year at Walsh College in Canton. Devon started coaching after leaving Walsh College and in in his 16th season as an I.B.A. coach. He loves the game of basketball and knows it well. Currently he coaches at all levels in the I.B.A.; the Bearcats in the Antioch League, the Eagles in the Vatican City League, and Marquette in the Boys Varsity League. He had also coached the Tigers in the Antioch League. As though he is not busy enough he coaches the boy's team at St. Charles in the C.Y.O. League and he gives additional time as an official in the I.B.A. leagues.

Devon and his wife Kim live in Parma. They have four boys, Shawn (11), who plays on the Eagles, John (8) who plays on the Bearcats, Blake who is 4 and Owen a 2-year-old. We're sure Blake and Owen will be I.B.A.'ers when they are a little older. Devon is employed (12 yrs.) at Phoenix Cement Inc. and Kim is an R.N. at the Clinic's Hillcrest Hospital.

2017 ST. IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH HALL OF FAME

Ron Bunner

Ron has been involved with the I.B.A. since his playing days that began in the 1990's. He attended St. Ignatius Graduating in 1999. While here he played in the I.B.A. leagues for Papal Guard in the Vatican City League and for Marquette in the Boys Varsity League. In those leagues he made it to two championship games and finished runner-up in each. He was selected as an All-Star each year receiving All-League status in both leagues.

Ron went on to John Marshall High School where he continued his athletic endeavors as a member of the Lawyers football squads. In 2003, his senior year, he was recognized as a selection to the East-West All-Star Game. Ron then enrolled at Muskingham College later transferring to Tri-C where he earned a degree in Criminal Justice.

Ron continues to give his time to the I.B.A. program where he is head coach of the Dayton Flyers in the Boys Varsity League who will play in the Championship Game tonight. He is also a licensed official and can be seen on the court during the Girls Varsity League Games. He recently took a position as Assistant Coach for the Beria-Mid Park High School Football Team starting this coming season.

Ron is a Police Officer in Lakewood, specializing in Field Training, since 2006 and his wife Tara (a Medical Assistant at U.H.) live in Berea with their two sons Cole (13) and Bryce (8) who both play in the I.B.A. The boys are also active in their community sports. They wrestle and play football in the Lou Groza League with dad as coach. Bryce has qualified for the State Wrestling Championships later in March.

Brian Kilbane

Brian has been a dedicated coach for many years (beginning when he was an assistant coach during his high school years) being a mentor to the hundreds of boys and girls who played under him in the I.B.A. Brian attended St. Ignatius Elementary, class of 1994. During his playing days he was not a super star but was dedicated to being the best he could be by playing to the best of his ability utilizing his knowledge of the game and his quickness on the court. Everything paid off as he played on a Championship St. Peter's team in the V. C. League and was an all-star selection in his final season as he and his Holy Cross Crusaders, under coach Pat McDaniel, made it to the 1994 championship game losing to an excellent Notre Dame squad who had Pete Latkovic, who later was an all-state player at S. Ed's helping them to a State Title in 1999.

Brian went on the St. Edward and played freshman and JV ball for the Eagles, graduating in 1998. During this time Brian began coaching as an assistant for the Villanova Girls team, becoming its head coach in 1998. He also took on additional coaching in the Vatican City league with the North American College Bulldogs and with Marquette in the Varsity league..

After graduation from St. Ed's Brian went on to The Ohio State University, obtaining a history degree. He then returned home and once again came back to the I.B.A. and has been with the program ever since. He helped first with Dayton in the Boys' Varsity and then took over Villanova in the Girls Varsity league where he still coaches today. The Lady Wildcats, under coach Kilbane have been in 12 championship games winning 7 titles along the way. Brian is well liked by his players and they are thrilled with his being inducted into the St. Ignatius of Antioch Hall of Fame.

Brian is employed by the Federal Reserve Bank and is in the Technology Dept. He is married to Jennifer (who works at Sentene-a Corporate Wellness Firm) and they live in Medina with the son Grady who is 4 years old. Although they live in the parish boundaries of St. Francis Xavier, they attend St. Ignatius of Antioch which they call their "home parish". Brian and Jennifer lost a daughter Keira to Leukemia in 2014. They carry on her memory through the Keira Kilbane Foundation. The Foundation has raised over \$65,000.00 to date and those donations benefit children's welfare and the fight against cancer.


